This schedule or timetable has the specific travel times of the route listed on the cover. The route number corresponds to the one found on the upper front of the bus. The purpose of route brochures is to help patrons plan their travel time and reduce unnecessary waiting at transit zones. Although difficulties in traffic may delay some buses, our Operators strive to maintain the schedule times printed in brochures.



Map Reference-Letters are used to correspond with timing points shown on the map. Footnotes Notes are made to show a departure from regular service. Garage trips and trips to Government Centre are indicated on the schedule.

Travel With Edmonton Transit

Exact Change

Edmonton Transit urges patrons to use exact change when travelling on buses. Transit operators do not provide change. To avoid delays, use **coins only**.

Transfer Policy

You should request a transfer when you pay your fare. Transfers are valid on any Edmonton Transit LRT or bus regular route on the date of issue and allow travel, including return trips, for a period of 90 minutes from the time of issue. As the proof of payment for your transit trip, transfers must be retained for your entire trip.

For Safety's Sake

Located directly behind the Operator is a "White Safety Line". Patrons should move behind this line to give the Operator a clear view of all mirrors and doors. Please help ensure a safe trip by moving to the back of the bus.


