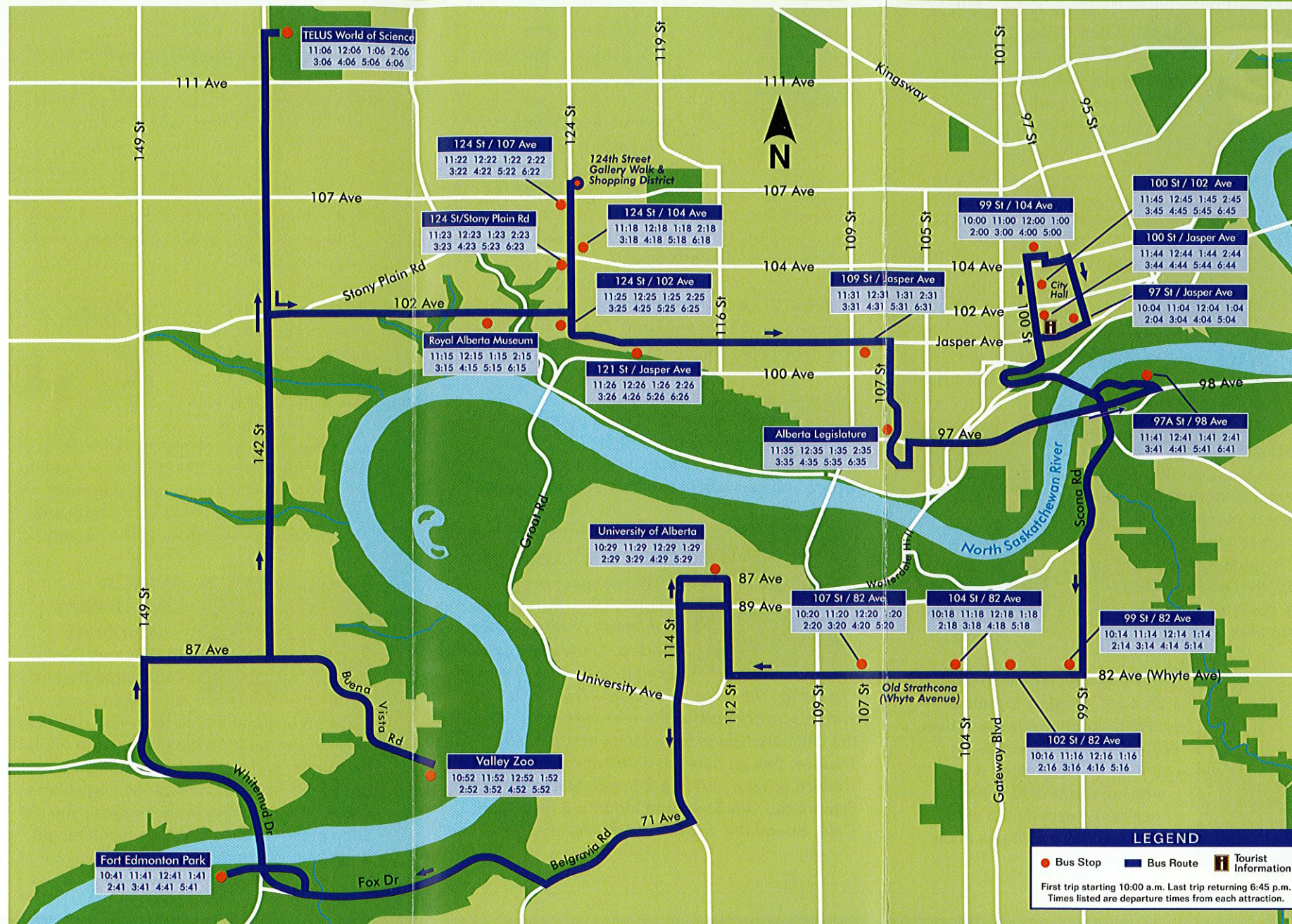
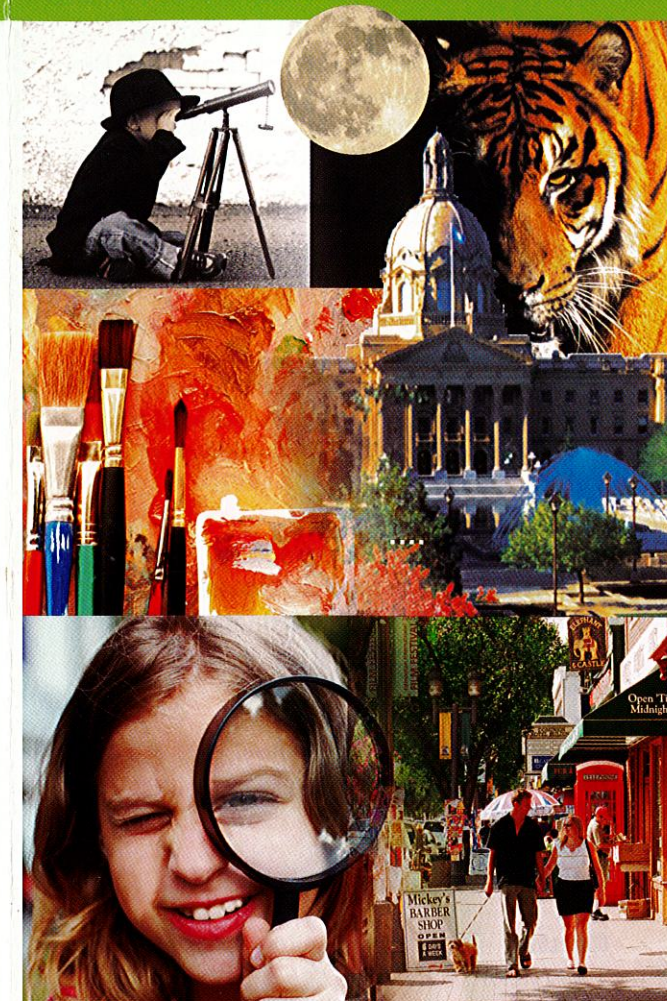

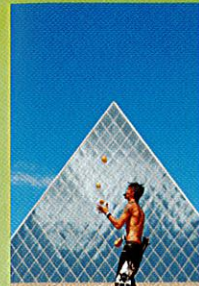

University of Alberta

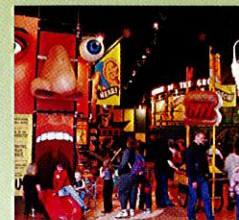

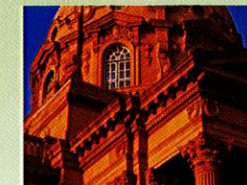
